-- Revelation 19:6-9

-- v. 9 – There is a heavenly wedding feast to come, in which all true believers will blissfully celebrate our eternal union to Christ as His bride.

-- The _____ serves as an image of that wedding feast.

-- The Lord's Supper calls us to live for Christ with the bliss of a bride!

-- A bride wants to be _____ for her wedding day.

-- This desire depicts the desire every believer should have to make ourselves beautiful for our groom, the Lord Jesus Christ.

-- We make ourselves beautiful for Christ by allowing Him to make us holy (v. 7-8).

-- The bride's dress is an image of the white robe of righteousness that we will be given on the day we are forever wed to Christ.

-- A bride is completely captivated and delighted by her _____.

-- The glow of a bride is a lesser image of the joy that ought to characterize us as Christ's bride.

-- Notice the attitudes of those who are participating in the Wedding Feast of the Lamb in (v. 6-7).

-- Because of our Wedding Feast to come, we ought to live these days with the bliss of the bride of Christ (John 3:29; Isaiah 61:10; 62:5; Psalm 40:16; Revelation 19:9, Psalm 37:4).
